Jerritson's story

Jerritson came to CHOAIDS through Grace Children's Hospital after being abandoned once his HIV+ status was confirmed. He was living at a local orphanage with his older sister, but after he began to get sick from opportunistic infections, his caretakers took him to the hospital for care. After spending a full day at the hospital going through testing, his HIV status was revealed. The staff who brought him to the hospital abandoned him there. The hospital staff knows of the work of CHOAIDS—they then contacted one of the members of our staff who worked at the hospital to place this little boy in a home.
